



WPTI: NYS Funding Boot Camp

Opportunity -

- NYSDOL received \$175 million in 2020 for a workforce initiative catering to immediate employer needs while addressing the long-term requirements of emerging industries in New York.
- Governor Kathy Hochul allocated \$350 million in 2022 towards workforce development, establishing the Office of Strategic Workforce Development (OSWD) within Empire State Development (ESD) to facilitate access to high-demand jobs in New York's rapidly growing sectors.

Challenge -

- Few NYC workforce development providers have applied for NYS funding or submitted state proposals due to limited experience.
- Some organizations have refrained from the state's CFA application process citing inflexibility, constraints on timeframes, funding amounts, and outcomes.
- Providers struggled to secure matching funds and cover operating costs due to potential delays in government contracts.
- CFA proposal reviews showed some NYC providers lacked innovation, strong partnerships, and focus on growing industries compared to other regions' proposals.

Solution ____

WPTI developed and led a two-session boot camp for workforce development providers to:

- Educate NYC's workforce community, especially smaller non-profits and those serving special populations, on current and new state funding and eligibility criteria.
- **Evaluate** interested organizations to pinpoint capacity weaknesses in their proposed workforce development plans and proposals.







WPTI: NYS Funding Boot Camp

Key Findings_

- Only 23% of organizations had previously applied for NYS workforce development funding. Of those who did apply, about 63% were successful in securing a contract.
- Most organizations didn't apply for state funding because the application was too complex (23%), the state's contracting process (18%), and too few employer partners were available (16%).
- Some organizations are avoiding the application process altogether the contracting and payment processes are structured in a way that is **not financially viable**.
- Organizations **need help completing complex forms**, like the Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) forms, to effectively manage budgets and proposals.
- Many organizations **face difficulty providing quality jobs,** particularly in industries like hospitality and the arts, especially in NYC where wages often don't meet the high cost of living.
